Elementary Age Summer Program 2020 Class/Activity Summary

Christian Education & Community Service: Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays & Fridays during summer camp, the Elementary Age will have Christian Education class. This summer, we will be using the "Kids' Travel Guide to the Armor of God" curriculum on Monday, Tuesday, & Friday. *The Kids' Travel Guide series* takes Elementary Age children on explorations that engage them with activities, stories, prayer, imaginative & interactive Bible lessons. Children will learn about having a strong relationship with God, make solid decisions based on the Bible, and stand firm in their faith. Every Wednesday, the kids will have Bible trivia games. Christian Education class will be split into upper & lower Elementary groups. Each Friday, we will choose a different community service project as part of our mission to give back to the community.

Arts & Crafts: Each week on Tuesday, the kids will get to make a take-home craft that ties into our theme week. Additional crafts will be added throughout the summer. Every Thursday, the kids will have a special Arts & Craft time with Mrs. Tabitha. Every Friday, Ms. Whitni & Ms. Lily will have a special Craft time for the kids to enjoy. Also, throughout the summer we will have a special Art Class with Mrs. Keri.

Music: Each Monday, the kids will pick songs at the start of Summer Camp to practice throughout the summer to perform at the end of the summer and record for all the parents to enjoy!

History Class: Each **Monday**, the upper Elementary kids will have History Class with Mr. Dillon. They will learn all types of history, including biblical, with fun activities and games.

Story Time: Each **Tuesday**, the lower Elementary group will have Story Time. Mr. Dillon will work with the North Davidson Public Library to pick out engaging, entertaining, age appropriate books to read aloud to the lower Elementary kids.

Oak Forest Cinema: Each Tuesday, the kids will have their own movie cinema. They will watch a movie that ties into our theme week on the large projection screen & sound system in the gym. All while enjoying popcorn & snacks.

Science Class: Each Wednesday, Ms. Monica will have Science Class with the kids with hands on activities and experiments.

Fitness Class: Each Thursday, the kids will have Fitness Class with Ms. Jessica. She will lead the kids in stretches, fun exercises, and active play.

Wheel Day: On Thursdays, kids are welcome to bring their bike, roller blades, skateboards, etc for use during outside play. This is optional. Please send appropriate safety gear.

Water Games: Each Friday, Mr. Jonathan will plan Water Games for the kids with water balloons, sprinklers, & more. After Water Games, the kids will have Free Water Play.

Talent Show: The kids will have the opportunity to perform at a Talent Show on July 29th. Throughout the summer, Mr. Mack will have sign-ups, dress rehearsals, and more to prepare for the Talent Show. The Talent Show will be recorded and streamed digitally for the parents to enjoy.

Themed Activities & Games: Each week staff will plan organized group games that tie into the theme week. Every **Wednesday**, there will be large themed activities planned by the staff or program-wide themed activities, such as the Carnival, Art Gallery & Talent Show.

Discipline Summary: We utilize "Time Outs" as our main behavioral modification tool. Time Outs involves temporarily separating a child from an environment where as unacceptable behavior has occurred. They will write their name on our "TIME OUT" chart under the appropriate day, which parents can monitor. They will then go to our "Time Out" area during Centers, Outside play, etc. Children's time-out period will be based on their age (i.e. a 10yr old will have a 10 minute timeout). If unacceptable behavior occurs frequently or is extreme, we will utilize others methods, such as restrictions on privileges, being sent to the Director's office, and parent involvement. We strive to maintain an open line of communication with parents/guardians in regard to their child's behaviors.
